You don't have time to go from website to website searching for new information, so we created a way for you to get all the news you need to know from us and put it where you are already going.




RSS (Real Simple Syndication)

RSS is basically a notification system to let you know about news and information from the National MS Society. We are offering this free service so that you may add it to your RSS readers.


You can find our RSS feed at the top of the www.MSohiobuckeye.org homepage.

Look for the  button. When you click it you will get what looks like a page of computer code...well, it is. But don't let that scare you, what you want is in the Address Bar of your browser. Highlight and copy the address it will look something like this http://msohiohome.org/Enews/rss/1117086155_MSOHA.xml.

Next go to your favorite RSS reader and paste the address into the subscribe box. That's all you have to do, from now on you will have up to date news and information from the National Multiple Sclerosis Society feed directly to you the instant it is posted.

If you already have a Yahoo, MyMSN, or Google account it is even easier. Simply click on the appropriate button for your account and you are an instant subscriber.   . (Impress your friends; tell them you just created a "Mashup" on your homepage. A Mashup is when you take parts of other websites and display them on yours.)

Don't have an RSS Reader? No problem. A variety of different readers are available, many of which are free. Some readers are downloaded and installed on your desktop while others are web-based. You can find a listing of free RSS readers [here](#). Once you have selected your preferred reader and registered, simply follow the instructions above to subscribe to the National MS Society Feed.

What if I only use a social networking page for my homepage? No problem, we have you covered. The last icon  is for our widget. Widget? What's a widget? A widget is a hunk of computer code that runs a small software application. In our case, it provides you with an RSS reader for your page on Facebook, MySpace, Twitter, etc. To get the code, click on the widget icon on www.MSohiobuckeye.org and follow the instructions.

Lastly, if you would prefer that we email you our popular monthly eNewsletter, send us an [email](#) and your email address will be added to the distribution list. But

please note, there are stories that will appear in the RSS feed that will not appear in the email version of the eNews.
